- 1.) Run through the lesson in full, beforehand.
 - Work out any glitches that come up.
 - Get a sense of the questions & possible responses.
- 2.) Before you begin, take a little time for the group to chat and enjoy fellowship.

- 3.) Start and end your time with the group in prayer.

 - Sometimes no one wants to talk first be the one to get the ball rolling.
 - Affirm and encourage when people do offer thoughts and opinions.
 - Include people in the conversation without putting them on the spot.
- 5.) Don't worry about having all the answers.
 - While you might be the one to start a conversation, these discussions are a group effort!
 - Look first and foremost to the Bible; research anything you're not sure about and bring it back to the group the next week.
